



The Shorkey Center exists to provide services for the individual with special needs. These services include effective physical, occupational, and speech rehabilitation; direct education services including therapy for children with autism and other related disorders; and parent assistance and support.

ABA Programs

Shorkey ABA programs provide educational and therapeutic instruction using the principles of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) for children with autism and related disorders, behavior difficulties and learning problems. Services include full time Day School and part time Community Outreach. Both programs entail one-on-one instruction. Every child receives an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) which is the basis for their program. We record data on a regular basis for every objective that is currently being targeted. Regular progress reports are given summarizing a student's data, mastered and current targets for each objective. A Board Certified Behavior Analyst oversees both programs.

Shorkey Kids in Day Treatment School (K.I.D.S.)

- ❖ ages 3-17 years
- ❖ educate students in their areas of delay, which may include but are not limited to: language, social and executive functioning skills, behavior management, academics/school readiness, self help, and domestic skills.
- ❖ Students receive occupational, physical & speech therapy as needed.
- ❖ Tuition: \$3425/month; funding sources vary
- ❖ Year-round program
- ❖ Monday - Friday - 8:30 A.M. - 2:30 P.M.
- ❖ Shorkey K.I.D.S. is a TEA-approved non-public school

Part-time Community Outreach

- ❖ work directly with an individual on specific deficits targeted by the caregivers
- ❖ provide training to caregivers or other professionals
- ❖ Tuition: \$50 per hour; financial aide available
- ❖ Ages: All
- ❖ Time: Varies - 1 hour/week up to 3 hours/day, depending on the needs of the child and the availability of community outreach staff.

Enrollment Process

To enroll a child in ABA services, call 838-6568 to schedule an information meeting and informal assessment with our Board Certified Behavior Analyst. Together she and the caregiver will determine the



services which best meet the needs of the child and the family. Clients will receive an enrollment packet including information about financial aid or funding sources at that time.
